

Title: How to find a full text article from a citation

Follow this outline to find the full text of an article from the citation information. If you have further questions, please watch the online tutorial or Ask a Librarian.

1. Read citation and identify journal title
2. Go to the library website (library.northeastern.edu) and click on E-Journals A-Z
3. Search for the journal's title
 - a. If journal found: Click on the journal title to see what years Northeastern has access to. Use the citation information to see if we will have access to your article.
 - i. Click on the journal link with access to the correct year of your article
 - ii. Navigate to the correct year/volume, then issue of the journal
 - iii. Scan the list of article titles for your article
 - iv. Congrats! You've found the full text of your article!
 - b. If journal not found:
 - i. Check [Scholar OneSearch](#) for the journal title. Hint: be sure to limit to journals under the material types filter on the left hand side of the page
 - ii. If journal still not found: submit an [interlibrary loan request](#) for your article via Illiad
 1. Help! I don't know what this means
