You may see multiple listings for the print and digital versions of the journal. Look to the left of the title for the referee shirt symbol.



This is the symbol for refereed.
Refereed means the journal has been
peer-reviewed. It means it's scholarly.

If you **don't** see the shirt, the journal
is NOT peer-reviewed. If you **do** see
the journal is peer-reviewed!

We can see the symbol next to the
*Journal of Personality and Social
Psychology*. Therefore, this journal is
peer-reviewed.

Also, check the page length -- If an article is a few pages or less, it is most likely not a peer reviewed article.
