The first step is to look for the name of the **journal**. This one is in the *Journal* of *Personality and Social Psychology*.





Enter the journal title into the search box. Use quotes around the title to help limit your results.





You may see multiple listings for the print and digital versions of the journal. Look to the left of the title for the referee shirt symbol.



This is the symbol for refereed. Refereed means the journal has been peer-reviewed. It means it's scholarly.

If you **don't see** the shirt, the journal is NOT peer-reviewed. If you **do see** the journal is peer-reviewed!

We can see the symbol next to the *Journal of Personality and Social Psychology*. Therefore, this journal is peer-reviewed.

However, keep in mind that not everything published in a peer-reviewed journal is a peer-reviewed article.

Academic journals publish editorials, book reviews, commentaries and short other pieces.


